## NAMESAKE FRANZ STOCK

Abbé Franz Stock (1904–1948) was born in Neheim and graduated from this school. He became a catholic priest and during the German occupation in World War II pastor for the prisoners of Paris and the place of execution on *Mont Valérien*. He is considered to be a pioneer of German-French friendship.
